Conservation: No Mow May

You may have heard of No Mow May as a way to welcome wildlife and pollinators to your yard this spring, but this is not such a good solution if the lawn has only one flowering species or consists of nonnative grasses that limit the needed habitat benefits.

Keep in mind, a lawn should be an area rug (not wall to wall carpeting) to benefit our Northern Michigan wildlife. Spacious lawns use too much water – an important consideration as our summers become drier. Instead of turf grass, wild ginger can be planted as a low-growing ground cover.

If you are concerned about neighborhood acceptance, offer

some teaching moments and add some human touches to your yard – such as birdbaths, benches, and lawn ornaments. Explanatory signage like "Pollinator Habitat" can help spark conversations with your neighbors.

Small spaces also work for rewilding. Containers of milkweed, native asters, or Joe Pye weed do well. You can also adorn your window boxes with native plants or plant flowering natives around your mailbox. No matter the size, you can make your yard a wildlife stopover or a "summer home" for pollinators!

Trillium Are Under Threat

Most people are familiar with the larger white-flowering trillium (Trillium grandiflorum) which is common in our woods, but there are actually eight different species of trillium thought to occur naturally in our state. Four are rare and are assigned "Threatened" or "Endangered" protected status in Michigan.

The biggest concerns for the sustenance of trillium populations are animal grazing (deer), urban development, and competition from invasive plants.

Soil Testing

MSU Extension has launched a new soil testing program for Michigan residents. Soil test mailers are available for home gardeners from the MSU Bookstore: https://shop.msu.edu/collections/garden-lawn/products/bulletin-e3154 or at the MSU Extension office in Charlevoix County (319B N. Lake Street, Boyne City) for a cost of \$26.

The mailer includes instructions on how to collect a soil sample, a simple form to fill out identifying what you plan to grow, a bag for the soil sample, and a postage-paid envelope. You will receive a report with easy-to-interpret instructions for adding recommended fertilizers or other amendments. 


Garden Walk 2023

Black Swallowtail Butterfly Initiative:

Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc., supports HB 4159 which was introduced by Rep. Julie Brixie and will have a hearing in the House Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism, and Outdoor Recreation Committee on Thursday, May 4. This bill will designate the Black Swallowtail as the official State of Michigan butterfly. Such a designation would promote the importance of pollinators which are crucial to Michigan crops. Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc., is working with the Michigan legislature and other organizations to support this bill. The Black Swallowtail is an appropriate ambassador for Michigan pollinators for the following reasons:

- It spends its entire life cycle in Michigan, overwintering as a pupa.
- Its habitat covers the entire state.
- It is not only non-threatening but also beautiful.
- It is easily spotted and identified as it lives close to the ground in our gardens and fields.
